The U.S. Department of Energy's Vehicle Technologies Office awarded E4 Carolinas a 3-year grant to conduct research, planning and training for the use of alternative fuel vehicles in improving first responder, utility and government services to enhance storm resilience and recovery. The project will cost \$1.68 million. \$827,000 in federal funds will be shared by E4 Carolinas, the Savannah River National Lab, the North Carolina Clean Energy Technology Center, the Southeast Alliance for Clean Energy, Triangle Clean Cities and Centralina Clean Cities. Cost share of \$856,000 will be provided by state and local project partners.
