This project is funded by the U.S. Department of Energy's <u>National Energy Technology</u> <u>Laboratory</u> from January 2020 through December 2022. It will enhance Carolina's alternative fuel vehicles fleet and fueling facility disaster preparedness, recovery planning, and resiliency by increasing alternate fuel diversity, specifically the use of alternative fuels for emergency response fleets that provide critical post-infrastructure disruption transportation and cleanup, utility restoration, and recovery. <u>Learn more</u>
